

2022 MN Student Survey: Mental Health & Risk Behavior Trends

Mental Health Concerns at Historic Highs:

- Over 135,000 students surveyed (Jan–June 2022)
- 29% reported long-term mental health issues (up from 23% in 2019, 18% in 2016)
- 11th Grade Females: 45% report long-term mental health issues (up from 35% in 2019)
- 11th Grade Males: 20% report issues (up from 18% in 2019)
- 11% identified as transgender, nonbinary, genderfluid, etc.
 - → 63% of these students report long-term mental health issues



MN Student Survey 2019/2022

MN Student Survey Data - Key findings

Enrichment Activities - outside the school day

- 80% young people spend 0 days participating in school sponsored activities that are not sports
- Close to an even split % of young people participate in sports/teams 0 days as 3-5 days
- 90% young people spend 0 days in community clubs/activities

Perceptions of Others and Family Caring

- 80% young people say Parents, adult relatives and friends Care About us quite a bit and very much!!
- 60% young people say school adults care quite a bit/very much
- 30% say adults in community care quite a bit/very much

After School

80-90% students spend 0 days at community spaces after school

Quality of Youth Activities - outside the school day

- 90% young people say often/very often feel safe outside of the regular school day!!
- 60% young people say often/very often spend time in trusting relationships with adults -


What have the Youths been up to?


