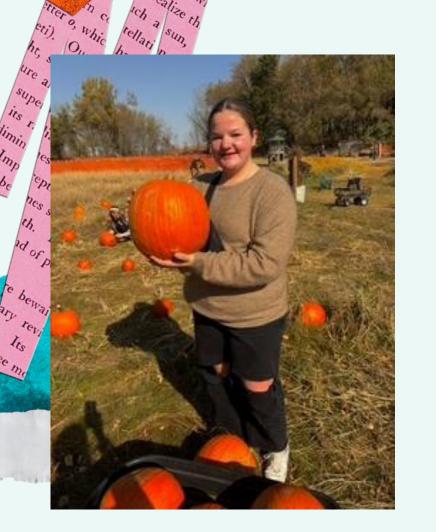

WHY PEER-TO-PEER?



Youth listen to youth!

Peer-led prevention = relatable, credible, powerful.

Younger students look up to older peers.









PER-TO-PEER BUILDS PROTECTIVE FACTORS

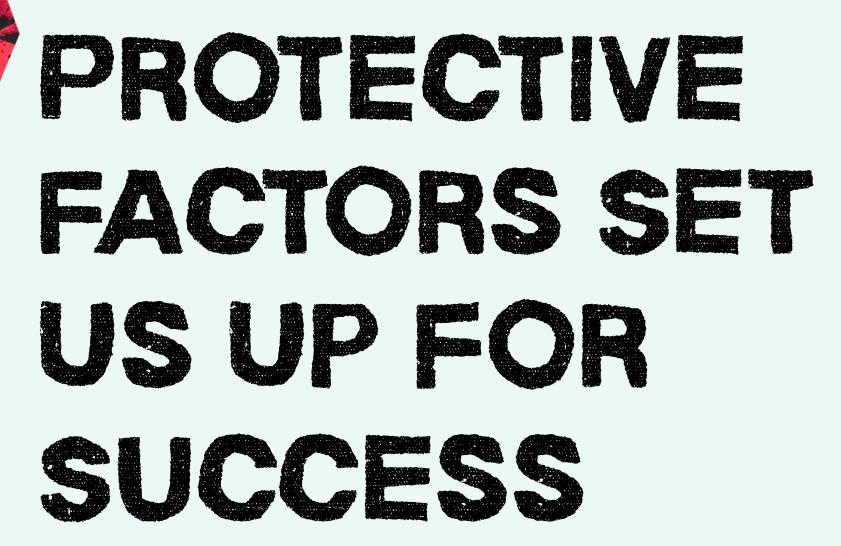
Peer-to-peer prevention helps strengthen the things that keep students safe and support healthy choices.

Protective factors = supports that help us make healthy choices and give us confidence.

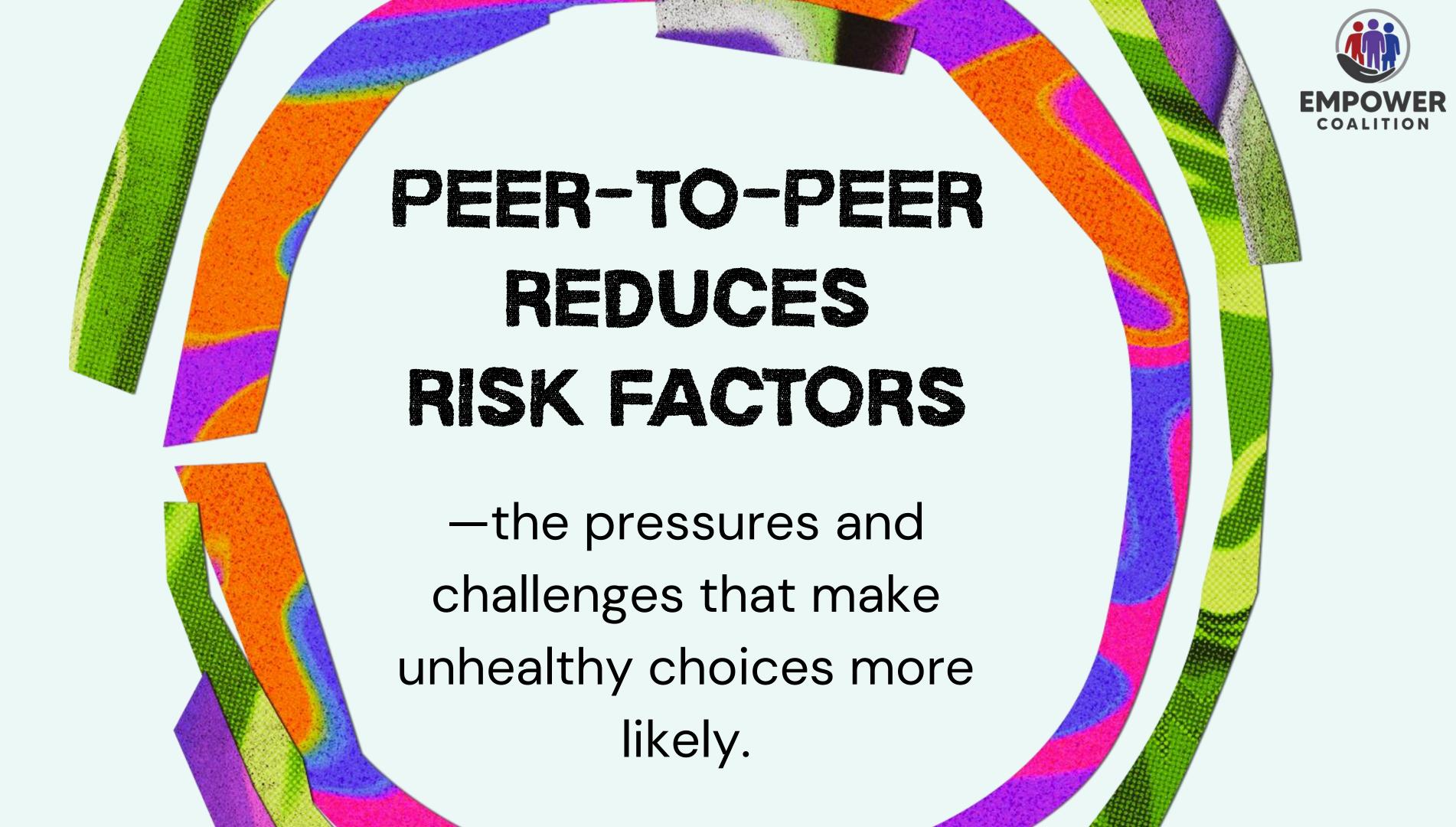


PROTECTIVE FACTORS WE BUILD

Peer-to-peer boosts protective factors:

- Leadership development
- Positive peer modeling
- School connectedness

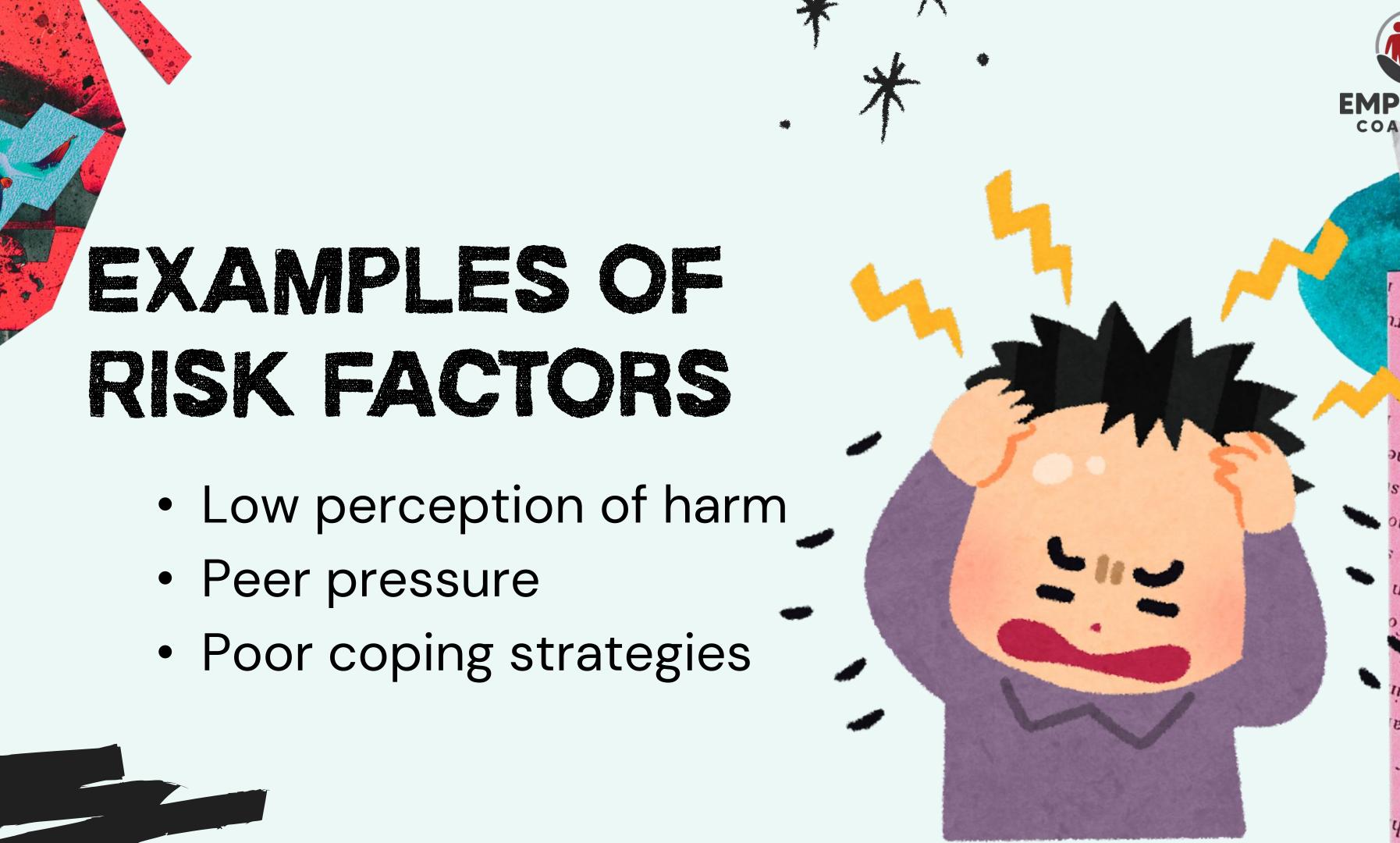






Risk factors = challenges in a student's life that raise the chances of unhealthy choices.







HOW PEER-TO-PEER HELPS

Peer-to-peer prevention...

- Raises awareness of risks
- Builds refusal skills
- Teaches healthy coping tools







WHY IT WORKS - CREDIBILITY

- Closer in age →
 "They get me"
- Peer norms shape choices
- Local data: ↑
 perception of harm
 after vaping
 presentations



WHY IT WORKS-CONNECTION

- Builds trust
- Students ask more questions
- Real connection: games & fun after presentations
- Local data: ↑ awareness of risks & digital safety









- Reaches kids before habits form
- Builds refusal skills & coping strategies
- Local data: Confidence to say no stayed strong

- Annual Youth Leadership
 Training
- Monthly Empower meetings

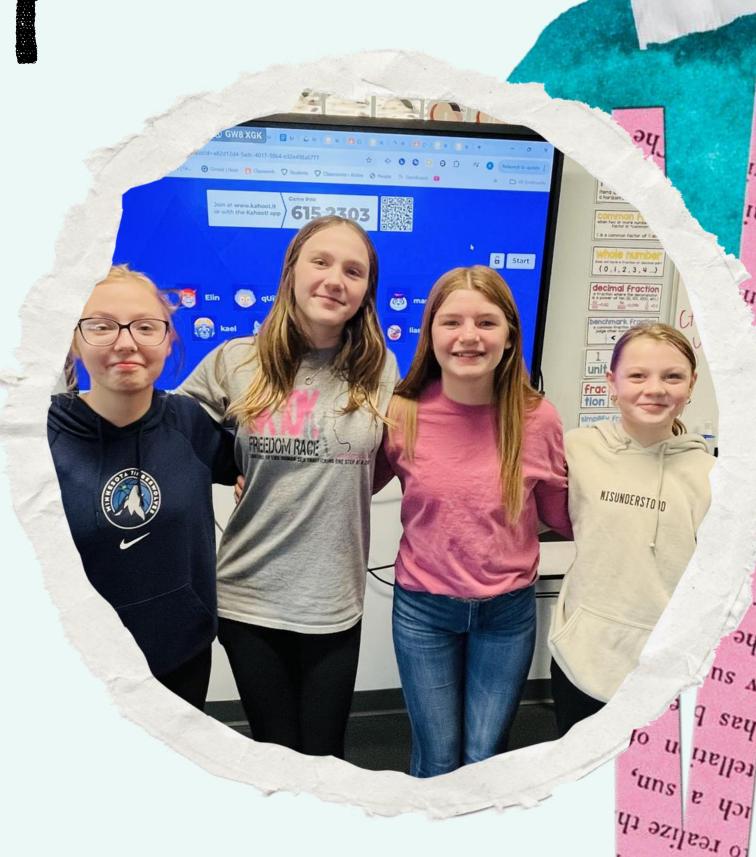
- Started small, built trust

- We work with what we have and keep growing



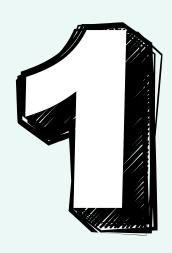
REFLEC

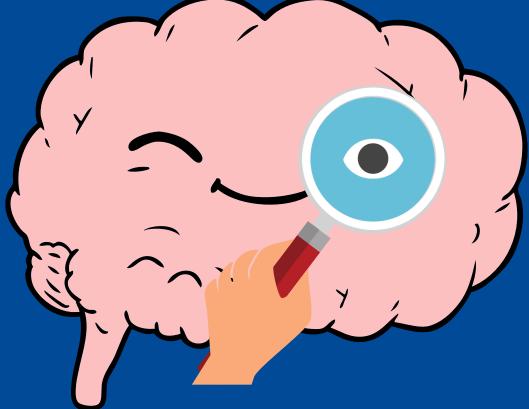




While this brain is looking for what she likes, it's at risk of getting tricked by things called drugs.

Drugs can trick a brain by making it think it likes the drug, and making it feel good at first









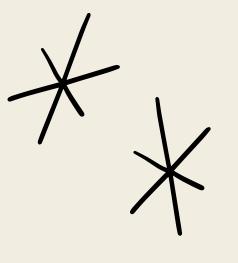


Keep your brain happy and healthy

- What's something we should keep or continue doing that's already working?



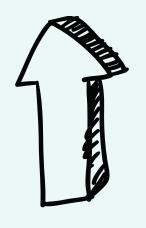
LOCAL IMPACT AT A GLANCE

- 48 Empower presenters

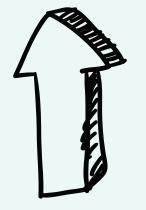

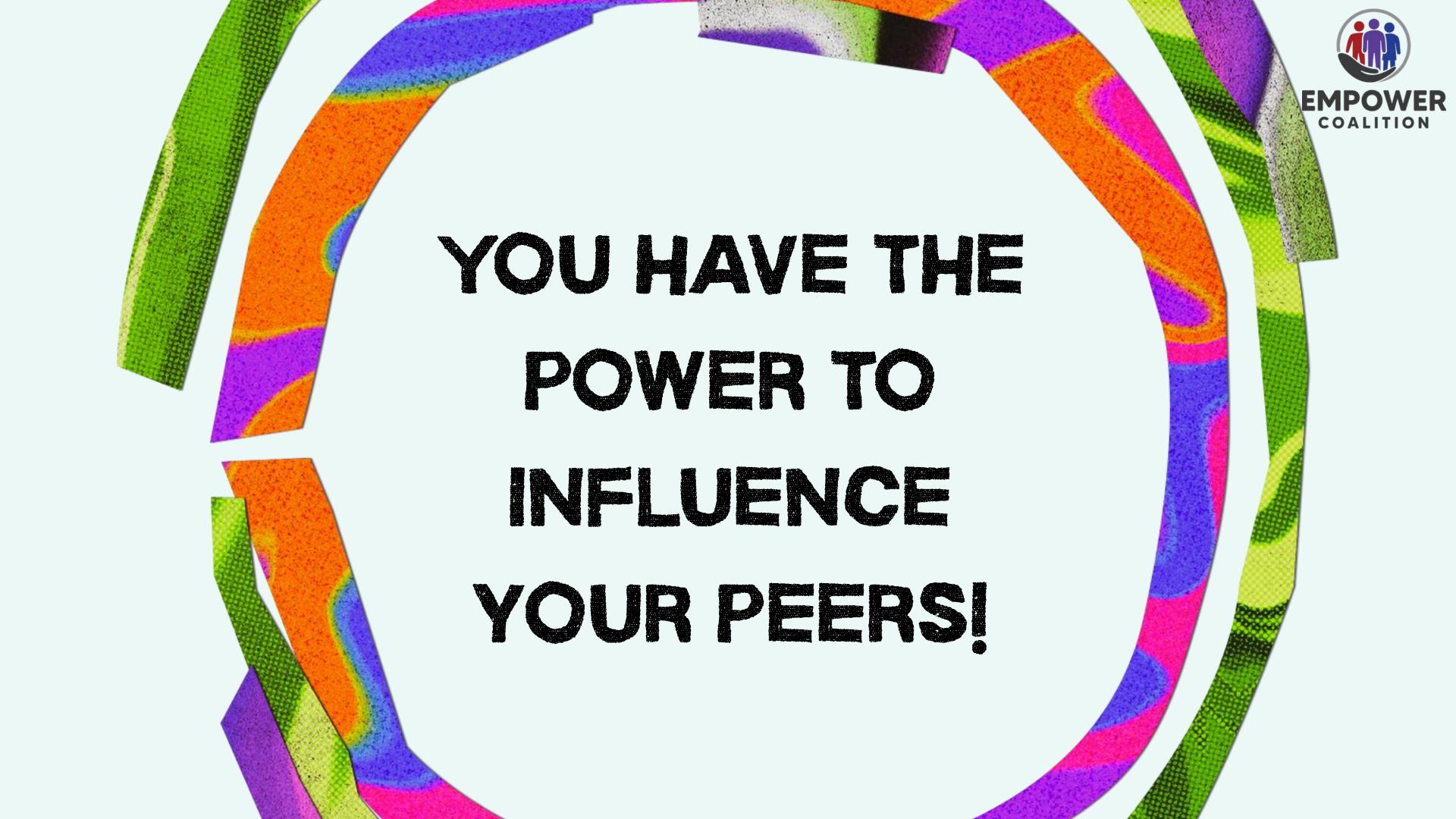


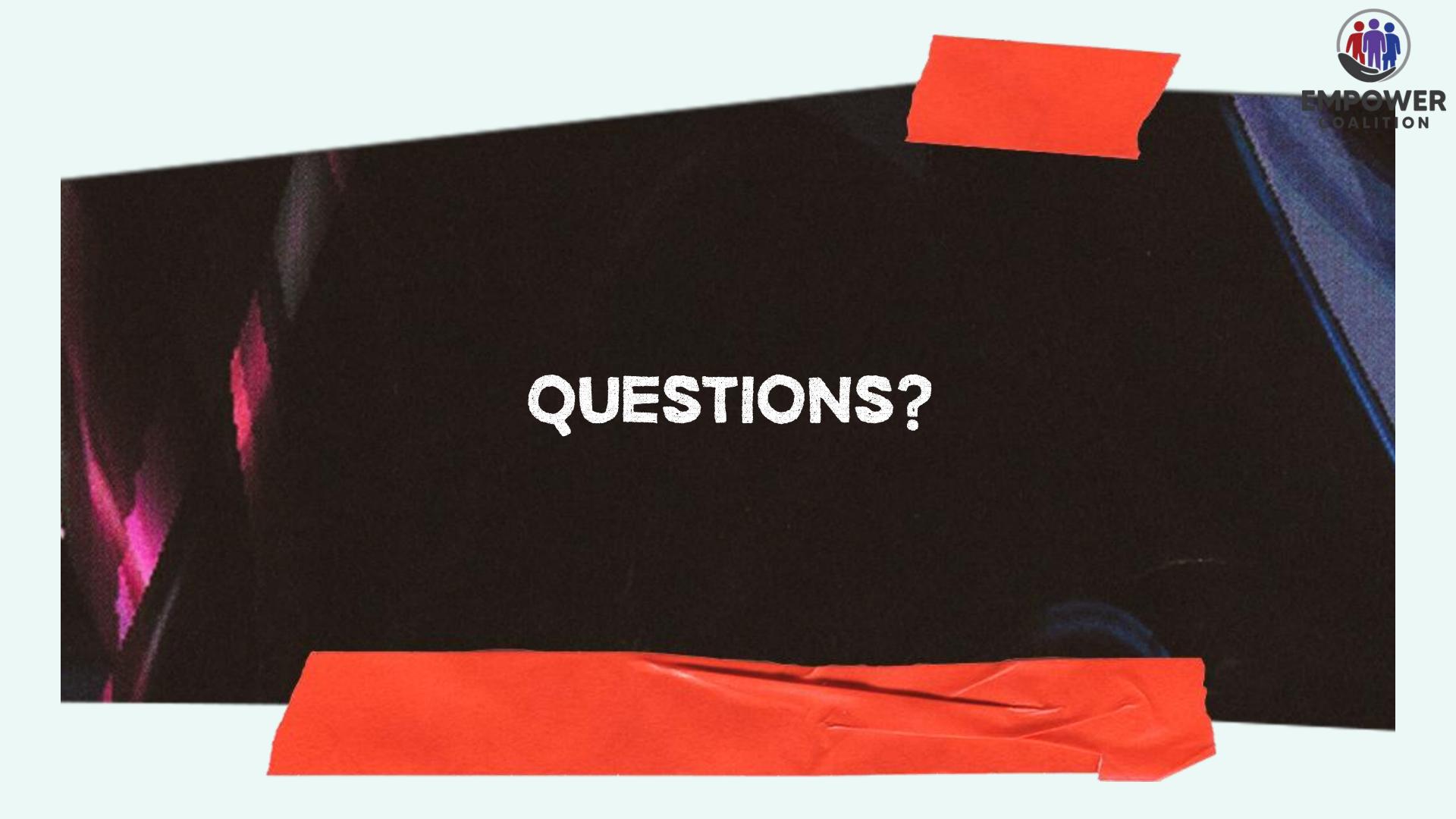


- Recruit a few friends

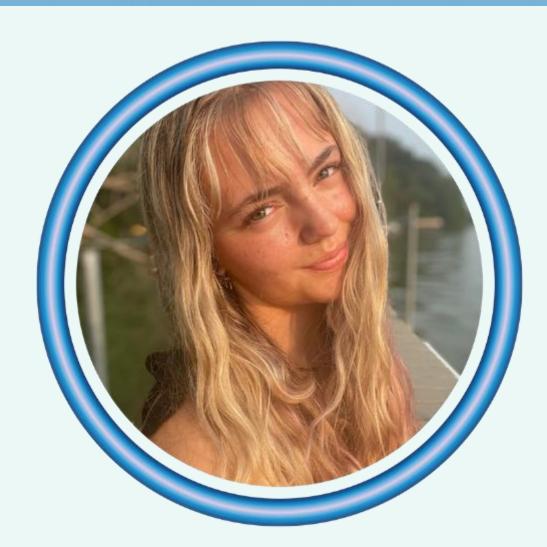


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
